SESSION #1 OPENNESS, TRANSPARENCY, AND SIN

Introduction to the session: If individuals participating in the Life Advance are to receive the maximum benefit possible, they must be able to be open and transparent before others. This is a critical aspect of the retreat and is the emphasis of the first night. Sin does not only affect the individual who committed the sin, but the consequences of sin affect the relationships around you.

Example: We can see how the sins of our nation affect the people of the nation. We can see how the sins of a husband or wife can destroy a family. We can see how gossip and lies destroy churches.

Each Believer must deal with the sins in their own lives. Unrepented sin, left alone, will grow and begin to bring havoc on the individual's life and the lives of those around them.

Be honest with yourself. You know your struggles. You know your temptations and you know your sins. Guess what? So does God, and He is waiting and ready to forgive and bring victory to these areas in your life.



The power for healing and forgiveness of your sins is in this cross, the suffering and death of Jesus:
But how do you gain possession of the power of the cross to change your life?

1. I need to take responsibility, that my sins caused Him to have to be crucified. Think about the sins in your life that nailed Jesus to the cross.
2. Once I have made the message of the cross, my personal responsibility, the power of transformation invades every aspect of my life.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

- a. The Holy Spirit, living inside of us, convicts and empowers us to resist and overcome sin.
- b. The Holy Spirit uses His voice, His Word, and godly counsel to transform us to be like Jesus.
(Righteous and Holy) Ephesians 4:24
- c. I no longer am a slave to sin, the power of the cross has set me free.

Romans 8:10-11 *And if Christ is in _____, the body is dead because of sin, but the Spirit is life because of righteousness. ¹¹ But if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in _____, He who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit who dwells in you.*

Remarks on numerous postmortems, pronounced the opinion that here we had a proof of the death of Christ being due not to the effects of crucifixion but to “laceration or rupture of the heart” as a consequence of supreme mental agony and sorrow. It is well attested that usually the suffering on the cross was very prolonged. It often lasted two or three days, when death would supervene from exhaustion. There were no physical reasons why Christ should not have lived very much longer on the cross than he did. On the other hand, death caused by laceration of the heart in consequence of great mental suffering would be almost instantaneous. In such a case the phrase “died of a broken heart,” becomes literally true.

Jesus did not struggle or fight with the soldiers who crucified him. He willfully laid down, spread out His arms and said I love you this much.

When Jesus said “Father forgive them, for they know not what they do” He was talking about us.

They crucified Jesus with His own tools, the tools of a carpenter. Wood, hammer, and nails.

We crucify Christ everyday with our sins. Nail your sins to the cross for the last time, repent, draw a line in the sand today. There is no turning back.

The Power Of The Cross:

It is essential that each Believer grasp the significance of what Jesus accomplished on the cross. Often we take what Jesus did for us for granted, but as the Holy Spirit reveals to us the depth of Jesus' suffering on the cross and the spiritual implications it has on our lives, we will begin to experience the freedom and victory that God desires for our lives.

1) Mark's account of the cross powerfully emphasizes Christ's suffering and death. (Mark 15:1-40)

- a) The cross was Christ's response to man's need of a _____ Savior. Sin required His substitutionary death once and for all. Through acceptance of Jesus' gift to us, we can have a relationship with God.

b) The cross was a Roman form of execution symbolizing that the one who died in such a fashion was cursed. Death on the cross involved tremendous _____, both physically and emotionally, before the person ultimately dies.

2) Jesus' suffering expressed His love and commitment to and for all mankind, regardless of race, gender, nationality, or socio-economic status (John 3:16; I Timothy 2:4; John 4:9,10).

I Timothy 2:4 - *who desires all men to be _____ and to come to the _____ of the truth.*

Consider His suffering. Every lash He took upon His back declared His great love for all people who would live on this planet He created.

Prayer: Take a few moments and ask God to make the cross a greater reality in your life. Ask Him to help you grasp the awesome price that was paid for your salvation.

Crucifixion! A medical doctor provides a physical description:

The cross is placed on the ground and the exhausted man is quickly thrown backwards with his shoulders against the wood. The legionnaire feels for the depression at the front of the wrist. He drives a heavy, square wrought-iron nail through the wrist deep into the wood. Quickly he moves to the other side and repeats the action, being careful not to pull the arms too tightly, but to allow some flex and movement.

The cross is then lifted into place. The left foot is pressed backward against the right foot, and with both feet extended, toes down, a nail is driven through the arch of each, leaving the knees flexed.

The victim is now crucified. As he slowly sags down with more weight on the nails in the wrists, excruciating fiery pain shoots along the fingers and up the arms to explode in the brain- the nails in the wrists are putting pressure on the median nerves. As he pushes himself upward to avoid this stretching torment, he places the full weight on the nail through his feet.

Again he feels the searing agony of the nail tearing through the nerves between the bones of his feet. As the arms fatigue, cramps sweep through his muscles, knotting them deep relentless, throbbing pain. With these cramps comes the inability to push himself upward to breathe. Air can be drawn into the lungs but not exhaled. He fights to raise himself in order to get even one small breath. Finally, carbon dioxide builds up in the lungs and in the blood stream, and the cramps partially subsided.

Spasmodically, he is able to push himself upward to exhale and bring in life-giving oxygen. Hours of limitless pain, cycles of twisting joint wrenching cramps, intermittent partial asphyxiation, searing pain as tissue is torn from his lacerated back as he moves up and down against rough timber.

Then another agony begins: a deep, crushing pain deep in the chest as the pericardium slowly fills with serum and begins to compress the heart. It is now almost over-the loss of tissue fluids has reached a critical level-the compressed heart is struggling to pump heavy, thick, sluggish blood into the tissues-the tortured lungs are making frantic effort to gasp in small gulps of air. He can feel the chill of death creeping through his tissues...Finally, he can allow his body to die...

All this the Bible records with the simple words, "... and they crucified Him" (Mark 15:24). What wondrous love is this? Many people don't know that pain and suffering our Lord, Jesus Christ went through for us... because of the brutality, crucifixion was given a sentence to only its worst offenders of the law.

Thieves, murderers, and rapists would be the types of people who were crucified. Yet, there was Jesus being crucified between two hardened criminals... What did Jesus do? Did He murder anyone? Did He steal anything? The answer as we all know is NO!! Jesus did nothing to deserve death, yet He went willingly to die, in between 2 thieves, so that we might be saved. And there, in between the sinners, was our Savior for all our sins.

The ability for one to be healed of the pain and guilt of past wounds and hurts is directly related to a person's ability to forgive one's self and others for all past sins that they have committed and all sins committed against them. We want you to allow God to speak to you. For this to happen you are going to have to deal with some of the past wounds and hurts in your life. This may be a very emotional time for some of you. We want you to remember that we are a family and we love and care about you. It is ok to let your emotions come out as you allow God to begin to heal you of the wounds and hurts that have been inflicted on you.

THE FOUR STAGES OF LIFE FOR PAST WOUNDS AND HURTS:

Childhood:

1. The wounds and hurts that we experience from infancy up until right before adolescence may or may not be remembered as an adult.
2. These wounds often play a significant part of how a child develops and how he or she will respond to other wounds or hurts they may experience in the future.
3. Individuals who may have caused us harm at this point in our lives could be parents, siblings, relatives, peers, teachers, and spiritual leaders.
4. Often it is during these early years that the seeds of hatred and insecurity are planted in the mind of a child.
5. **Our character and moral values are often determined by the things that we have experienced or have been taught during this crucial period of early development.**

Some children who have been labeled with clinical behavioral disorders are children who are acting out and responding to the pains and hurts in their lives. Society chooses to deal with these problems by using technical names and medications. We believe that by applying biblical principles that even the youngest of children can be healed of the pains and wounds in their lives. We are NOT implying that medical psychology or treatment with medications do not have their benefits, however we believe that God has the ability to heal and restore our past emotional wounds.

Adolescence:

1. This stage of our lives, from preteen to shortly after the high school years are often a difficult and vulnerable time.
2. During this phase we are developing both emotionally and physically.
3. It tends to be a time when we begin to searching for personal significance.
4. It is a period when a person enjoys neither the privileges of childhood nor the freedoms of adulthood.
5. If strong values are not established by this time, peer pressure and social values will dictate our future as an individual.
6. Wounds and hurts have a much greater impact on us at this time of our lives and our responses to them may be as varied as attempting suicide or violent outbursts toward others.
7. No matter how we responded to these wounds and hurts, be it inwardly or outwardly, if not dealt with properly they may still be affecting our lives today.

Wounds experienced during childhood often lead to actions that bring about more hurts during these teen years. During this time, teens often turn to drugs or alcohol as a way to escape the pains and hurts they've experienced and some even turn to sex as a way to fill a void in their lives, not

realizing that all of these lead only to more pain and hurt. Drugs and alcohol become an addiction that compounds and complicates their ability to be healed of the wounds and hurts in their lives.

Sexual relationships at this time often lead to multiple partners creating soul ties that bring further guilt and unfulfillment.

Early Adulthood:

1. Career and marriage choices are being made at this stage in our lives and we finally have experienced personal freedom as an adult.
2. These things that we thought would make us happy and complete, has made life more complicated than we expected. (College, job, marriage or kids -whether by choice or as the result of poor decisions or personal mistakes)
3. For some, these very same things become a doorway for hurts or wounds in our lives.
4. For others, it compounds upon the wounds and hurts that they have experienced in the past.
5. In either case it may lead to depression, anxiety or a sense of overwhelming discouragement.
6. We realize that something is extremely wrong but because we have been wounded so many times we may have a hard time putting our finger on exactly what is bothering us.
7. For some, the first real signs of bitterness and resentment begin to be manifested outwardly through our actions.

Latter Adulthood:

1. By this stage of our lives the children have become somewhat independent and possibly are grown or out on their own.
2. The job is not as exciting as it used to be or worse yet never became what it should have been.
3. The marriage, whether your first or second, lacks the romance that you so desired.
4. You may be one of those, because of a divorce or an untimely death, who are facing the reality of spending the rest of your life alone.
5. At this stage of life you have experienced victories as well as defeats.

We have coined phrases like “mid-life crisis” or “second childhood”. It is quite possible that the reality of the pains and hurts in our lives are so overwhelming to us that in order to cope, we feel the need to make a radical change(s). Many times, these choices are self-centered and we care very little about the effect that they will have on the people around us. We fail to see that these choices continue to add more pain and hurt to our own lives as well as to the lives of others.

6. For some reason you seem unable to focus on anything other than the losses and the failures.
7. Worse still is the fact that it seems that there is not enough time to correct all the wrongs and the reality that there are some things you can no longer go back and change seems to haunt you. The thought that torments them is, “I wasted my life and there is not enough time left to do anything about it.”

The only thing worse than having a bad day is being with a person who’s had a lifetime of “bad days”. You can be assured that tomorrow is going to be a bad day for them too. This individual places his hope for the future based on what has happened in the past. They will tend to do one of two things:


- a. Blame everybody else for their problems or
- b. Blame themselves for all the wrong things that have or will happen to them. (This person is known for their overwhelming negative attitude.)

The truth is, no matter where you may be in these four stages, **THERE IS HOPE FOR YOU!**

EVERY WOUND AND/OR HURT IN OUR LIVES CAN BE BROKEN DOWN INTO TWO PARTS:

The Fruit: This refers to what was produced in your emotions and how you now respond to situations. It is the surface problems, **the fruit caused from the root.** This may range from mild emotional damage to deep emotional and physical damage.

The Root: This refers to the deeper underlying source of the problem. It is often hard for an individual to discern the difference between the **fruit** and the **root** of a hurt or wound in their life.



Here is an Example: A child raised in an extremely dysfunctional home. The Fruit would be that he/she made poor life choices, including relationships. The Root is a root of rejection.

The way we respond to certain situations may be directly related to wounds or hurts that you experienced prior to that situation. If you experienced rejection or abandonment in a previous relationship, you may have a natural tendency to go from one relationship to another. This is true in the church as well. If you hop from church to church, this too may indicate that you're still suffering from a previous wound or hurt.



Satan would have you to focus on the fruit rather than on the root of the hurt or pain in your life. Just like a weed in a garden, unless you get to the root, the weed will continue to come back to the surface to expose its ugly self. So it is with the roots of the wounds and hurts in our lives. You may feel that you have dealt with the pain that a certain wound has caused, yet you continue to experience outward emotional effects from that wound. **Let's get to the root!**

COMMON ROOTS OF PAIN AND HURTS:

Rejection:

1. Rejection results from the denial of love.
2. When one is loved, he is approved and accepted.
3. When one is rejected, he is disapproved and refused.
4. Rejection can come in many forms (i.e. individual rejection, peer rejection, spouses rejection and church related rejection).
5. These examples can lead to self rejection and/or the fear of rejection.

Abuse:

1. Abuse is injury or damage resulting from mistreatment.
2. Abuse generally occurs in three forms: **verbal abuse, physical abuse and sexual abuse.**
3. We cannot minimize the effect that these have on our lives.

Tragedy:

1. Tragedy is an extremely sad or fatal event or course of events.


2. The loss of someone or even the loss of something valuable can have a long lasting impact on our lives.

Jealousy:

1. Jealousy is the overwhelming need to have or obtain more than what is natural or allowed based on what others possess.
2. It most often stems from feelings of inadequacy but can be projected on individuals as well.

Gossip:

1. Gossip is the act of spreading facts or rumors with the intent to hurt another individual or to better one's self at the expense of others.
2. **Forms of gossip are evil reports, slander, lying and character assault.**




Possible Roots to the Wounds and Hurts in My Life

As we can see from the things that we have listed above, there may be many roots in our lives. We want God to pull out those roots so that they no longer affect us. Introduction

The ability for one to be healed of the pain and guilt of past wounds and hurts is directly related to a person's ability to forgive one's self and others for all past sins that they have committed and all sins committed against them. Often, surface emotions such as anger, fear and depression and many other outward expressions, are a result of a person's failure to forgive others that have wounded them. Some individuals suffer the same types of emotional symptoms because they are unable to forgive themselves for sins that they have committed against others. These emotional responses in both cases, be it obvious to an individual or not, are symptoms rather than the root causes of one's problems. Let's take a deeper look at what God has to say about forgiveness and our responses to individuals and circumstances.

Hebrews 4:12 *For the word of God is living and _____, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart.*

God's word is _____. (**Hebrews 4:12**) Let us begin with the basic principle that as Believers we need our lives to resemble that of Christ's (1 John 2:6). This happens as we seek to know Christ through studying His Word and being open to what He desires to speak to us through His Spirit. Before we move on we would like you to ask yourself four questions.

1. **Am I teachable?** Yes or No

2 Tim 3:16 exhorts us that all scripture is profitable for instruction, correction and reproof.

2. **Am I willing to be transformed into Christ's image?** Yes or No

1 Peter 2:1-3 exhorts us to rid ourselves of all malice and all deceit, hypocrisy, envy and slander of every kind. Like newborn babes, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation, now that you have tasted that the Lord is good. (NIV)

3. **Am I willing to be changed by God's written word?** Yes or No

Romans 12:2 exhorts us to not be conformed to this world but to be transformed by the renewing of your mind.

4. **Am I willing to verbally act upon things God shows me?** Yes or No

Romans 10:10 teaches us that it is with the mouth that we confess unto righteousness.

If you answered yes to each of these questions then you are willing to allow God to speak to you about areas of unforgiveness in your life.

Take a minute to write down a prayer and thank God for His Word and ask His Spirit to begin to show you areas of your life that you need to work on as we continue through this topic of forgiveness.

Eight Principles of Forgiveness (Matthew 18:22-28)

Principle 1 Forgiveness requires we take account.

Jesus said to him, 'I do not say to you, up to seven times, but up to seventy times seven.' And when he had begun to settle them (the accounts of the servants) there was brought to him one who owed him ten thousand talents (Matt. 18:22, 24). If we want true freedom from our offender, we must ask God to reveal areas of unforgiveness.

Principle 2: A debt only _____ can repay.

If we look to the offender for healing, restitution or compensation, we will only be more wounded. The one who has caused the pain does not have the means to repay the debt or remove the pain from our lives. *But as he was not able to pay,* (Matt. 18:25). The abuser can not repay.

Principle 3 Anger must be _____.

Anger is a normal reaction to injustice, but must be released before freedom will come. *But as he was not able to pay, his master commanded that he be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and that payment be made.*(Matt. 18:25).

Principle 4: Forgiveness is not dependent on the offender.

The integrity and sincerity of the indebted wounder is _____critical for true forgiveness to be administered. *The servant therefore fell down before him, saying 'Master, have patience with me, and I will pay you all.'* (Matt. 18:26). Forgiveness is a cutting off, a release or sending away of the offense or debt.

Principle 5: Forgiveness _____ compassion.

Then the master of that servant was moved with compassion, released him, and forgave him the debt. (Matt. 18:27). The peace and compassion we feel enable us to truly release another's debt.

Principle 6: Forgiveness offers emotional release.

Forgiveness emotionally _____ the one offering the forgiveness, but may have no impact on the one whose debt is cleared. The king *released him, and forgave him the debt. But that servant went out and found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denari; and he laid his hands on him and took him by the throat, saying, 'Pay me what you owe!'* (Matt. 18:27-28).

Principle 7: Forgiveness does not always lead to reconciliation.

There is no evidence the king and servant ever became friends or had lunch together. Reconciliation may or may not come as a result of forgiveness.

Principle 8: Forgiveness is a Process.

Forgiving an offender is not necessarily a one-time act, when an offense from the past stings the memory again, we must choose to continue to walk in forgiveness.

Four Stages of Forgiveness

When the heart has been hurt and when trust has been betrayed, there is a process of restoration we must walk through. Knowing where you are in the forgiveness process can help you as you seek to walk in forgiveness.

#1 Acknowledge the Hurt.

1 Peter 4:12 *Beloved, do not think it strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened to you.*

#2 Admit Your Feelings.

Titus 3:3 *For we ourselves were also once foolish, disobedient, deceived, serving various lusts and pleasures, living in malice and envy, hateful and hating one another.*

#3 Choose to Heal.

Phil 4:13 *I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.*

#4 Forgive as Jesus Forgave.

Colossians 3:13 *Bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do.*

To Forgive Or Not To Forgive? Scripture is very clear that as Christians it is necessary for us to make sure that we maintain an attitude of forgiveness. Many Christians however, fail to focus on this area of their spiritual walk or tend to think that it is not an important part of daily discipline. Christ made this point very clear when He was teaching His disciples to pray (Matthew 6: 9-15). Let's look at some other reasons we may tend to **fail** to forgive.

Reasons We Fail To Forgive Others.

1. We fail to remember exactly how much God has forgiven us and that we are commanded to forgive others based upon the forgiveness we have received.

Colossians 3: 13 *bearing with one another, and _____ one another, if anyone has a complaint against another, even as Christ _____ you, so you also _____ do.*

The unforgiving are: lonely, emotionally unstable, irritable, resentful, joyless, fearful, defensive, and negative.

So with this baggage the unforgiving often have: difficulty communicating, a critical spirit, outburst of anger, self-centered attitudes, trouble with intimacy, an inability to risk, a negative attitude, difficulty feeling close to God.

Some of us are carrying this baggage around with us. Some of us think I only have this small little baggage. Some of us put our baggage in the closet thinking no one will see it. Some of us hide it under the bed, but God sees your baggage and He knows that the baggage is just the symptoms of unforgiveness but that the root of your unforgiveness is what's inside.

Unforgiveness impacts ourselves as well as others around us. Through the process of forgiveness you can get rid of this baggage.

Hebrews 12:1 *Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every _____, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us,*

Examples Of Forgiveness:

These are designed to allow the Holy Spirit to jog your memory of areas where you choose forgive.

1. My FATHER GOD: *When death has come into my family, hard times, financial difficulties, or what I thought were punishments from God and people said "It's God's will," and I became bitter and resentful toward my loving Father .*

2. MYSELF: *For my sins, faults and failings, for all that is bad in myself or that I think is bad, I forgive myself; and I accept Your forgiveness.*

I further forgive MYSELF for taking Your name in vain, not worshipping You by gathering in Biblical community, for hurting my parents, getting drunk, for sins against purity , bad books, bad movies, fornication, adultery, homosexuality. Also, for abortions, stealing, lying defrauding, hurting peoples' reputation. You have forgiven me today, and I forgive myself.

I also forgive myself for any delvings in superstition, using ouija boards, horoscopes, going to séances, using fortune telling or wearing lucky charms, I reject all that superstition and choose you alone as my Lord and Savoir. Fill me with Your Holy Spirit.

3. My MOTHER: *I truly forgive my MOTHER. I forgive her for all the times she hurt me, she resented me, she was angry with me and for all times she punished me. I forgive her for the times she preferred my brothers and sisters to me. I forgive for the times she told me I was dumb, ugly, stupid, the worst of the children or that I cost the family a lot of money. For the times she told me I was unwanted, an accident, a mistake or not what she expected, I forgive her.*

4. My FATHER: *I forgive him for any non-support, any lack of love, affection or attention. I forgive him for any lack of time, for not giving me his companionship, for his drinking, arguing, fighting with my mother or the other children. For his severe punishments, for desertion, for being away from home, for divorcing my mother or any running around, I do forgive him.*

5. My SISTERS AND BROTHERS: *I forgive those who rejected me, lied about me, hated me, resented me, competed for my parents' love, those who hurt me, who physically harmed me. For who were too severe on me, punished me or made my life unpleasant in any way, I do forgive them.*

6. My SPOUSE: *For lack of love, affection, consideration, support, attention, communication; for faults, failings, weaknesses and those other acts or words that hurt or disturb me.*

7. My CHILDREN: *For their lack of respect, obedience, love, attention, support, warmth, understanding; for their bad habits, falling away from the church, and any bad actions which disturb me.*

8. My IN-LAWS, MY MOTHER-IN-LAW, FATHER-IN-LAW, SON/DAUGHTER-IN-LAW AND OTHER RELATIVE By Marriage: *Those who treat my family with a lack of love. For all their words, thoughts, actions or omissions, which injure and cause pain, I forgive them.*

9. My RELATIVES: *My grandmother and grandfather, aunts, uncles, cousins, whom may have interfered in our family, been possessive of my parents, who may have caused confusion or turned one parent against the other.*

10. My CO-WORKERS: *Those who are disagreeable or make life miserable for me. For those who put their work off on me, gossip about me, won't cooperate with me, try to take my job, I do forgive them.*

11. My NEIGHBORS: *For all their noise, letting their property run down, not tying up their dogs who run through my yard. Not taking in their trash barrels, being prejudiced and running down the neighborhood, I do forgive them.*

12. My CHURCH: *From the past for their lack of support, affirmation, bad sermons, pettiness, lack of friendliness, not providing me or my family with the inspiration we needed, for any hurts they have inflicted on me or my family, even in the distant past, I forgive them today.*

I forgive all those who are of different PERSUASIONS, those of opposite political views who have attacked me, ridiculed me, discriminated against me, made fun of me, economically hurt me. I forgive those of different religious DENOMINATIONS AND BELIEFS who have harassed me, attacked me, argued with me, forced their views on me or my family. Those who have harmed me ETHNICALLY, have discriminated against me, mocked me, made jokes about my race or nationality, hurt my family physically, emotionally or economically, I do forgive them today.

13. PROFESSIONAL PEOPLE: *who have hurt me in any way: doctors, nurses, lawyers, judges, politicians and civil servants. I forgive all service people: policemen, firemen, bus drivers, hospital workers and especially repairmen who have taken advantage of me in their work.*

14. My EMPLOYER: *For not paying me enough money, for not appreciating my work, for being unkind and unreasonable with me, for being angry or unfriendly, for not promoting me, and for not complimenting me on my work.*

15. My SCHOOLTEACHERS AND INSTRUCTORS: *From the past as well as the present. For those who punished me, humiliated me, insulted me, treated me unjustly, made fun of me, called me dumb or stupid, made me stay after school, I truly forgive them today.*

16. My FRIENDS: *Those who have let me down, lost contact with me, do not support me, were not available when I needed help, borrowed money and did not return it, gossiped about me.*

17. For the ONE PERSON in my life who has HURT ME THE MOST: *I forgive anyone who I consider my greatest enemy, the one who is the hardest to forgive or the one who I said I would never forgive.*

The individual who seeks to forgive others, removes the potential for bitterness to root in. Bitterness left to fester will damage and destroy one's life. By forgiving, you are freeing yourself from bitterness.

Once we have forgiven those who have hurt or wounded us we need to pray for them and find ways to bless them. (Do not condone their sin.)

A. Overview: Strongholds and Curses

II Corinthians 10:4 *For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, (Deuteronomy 5:9b-10; 18:9-14; 28:15-58; 29:25-28; Jeremiah 16:10-13).*

The Old Testament scriptures create differences in doctrinal perspectives, but we would all agree that strongholds exist today and that the Believer should seek freedom from these strongholds. We acknowledge that there are many different theological convictions as it relates to strongholds and curses that we could debate over, but we are here to seek the victory that Jesus has won for us.

Introduction: The word stronghold means to fortify. Believers can have stronghold of blessings, or unhealthy strongholds in their lives.

Example: We can live in a stronghold of righteousness or a stronghold of freedom. These are positive strongholds that are healthy for our spiritual well being.

Unhealthy strongholds are the result of our sins or the sins of preceding generations. The enemy will use specific sins to hinder, if not destroy, a persons' growth in the Lord. He uses these sins to fortify his interest to kill, steal and destroy (John 10:10).

Example: You can see a cycle of abuse from generation to generation. You can see a history of alcoholism or drug addiction, a lack of submission to authority, sexual sins, etc... All these are areas that the enemy has had the freedom, through unrepented sin, to fortify and wreak havoc on peoples' lives.

Curses are negative words spoken over your life. When the recipient of the curse believes and accepts the lie (the negative words spoken over them), it allows the curse to become reality in their daily life.

But the blessing is that the Bible instructs us that as Believers we have spiritual weapons to destroy the works of the enemy.

II Corinthians 10:4 - *For the _____ of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down _____.*

The Bible gives us divine warning that the sins of the parents can have devastating consequences on the children. When parents willfully rebel against God, they open themselves to strongholds and potentially these same sins could be repeated through future generations.

The good news is that Jesus paid the price for these strongholds to be broken in our lives. Strongholds are broken when we recognize, repent of, renounce, and cast them off in the mighty name of Jesus.

Indications of a Unhealthy Stronghold and or curse

The following pages list some symptoms that may indicate the presence of strongholds and or curses in one's life. These are areas that often times happen as a result of strongholds but they **do not** necessarily prove that those who struggle with these issues do so because of strongholds. We must be very sensitive to the Holy Spirit to reveal these strongholds and not jump to conclusions. We do not want to go overboard and attempt to find, "a demon behind every door knob". *The operative words here are: "Be sensitive to the Holy Spirit on this issue."* As you read through the list, if the Holy Spirit speaks to you about a stronghold (or curse from past generations) in your life, receive His guidance, wisdom, and healing.

Within the following list of strongholds (curses) , some may be evident in your life while others may not apply to you. Just allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you.

Strongholds are areas where the enemy has been able to fortify in one's life. The enemy then bombards the individual with constant temptations in a particular area of sin. **The sin is our choice.** This is why breaking the strongholds in our lives is so important.

Curses are negative words spoken over your life. When the recipient of the curse believes and accepts the lie (the negative words spoken over them), it allows the curse to become reality in their daily life.

Receiving freedom from our strongholds and curses - destroys the enemies grip and therefore makes it easier to make righteous choices in our lives.

James 4:7 *Therefore submit to God. Resist the Devil and he will flee from you.*

1. **An Inability to Prosper**

Remember that prosperity means more than simply monetary gain. It also deals with happiness, friends, fulfillment, etc. Prosperity could deal with one's finances, but it may also deal with one's ability to prosper in fulfillment of God's plans for your life. All or some may apply to your life.

- a. This person studies and works hard but always seems to fail at his goals and struggles with applying healthy principles and skills.
- b. You acquire the proper skills, but success eludes you.
- c. Failure seems almost inevitable.
- d. Depression often settles in like a cloud, due to frustrations.
- e. You often say things such as: "Nothing ever goes right for me."
- f. Money seems to come in and go right back out and you are never able to get ahead.
- g. Credit cards are too great of a temptation for you.
- h. Unhealthy debt is a part of your life.
- i. Financial decisions are typically made on impulse, rather than a well thought out decision.
- j. A family history of never being able to get ahead and always on the verge of bankruptcy.

We must be very careful that we not use the Devil as a "scapegoat" for our own unwillingness to learn and apply Biblical principles. A more balanced approach to this topic on "an inability to prosper" may simply be our own lack of learning and applying biblical principles to our lives. Our own family's past may show a history of failing to use biblical principles. In this instance, one must break the strongholds that hindered one from receiving and

applying sound biblical principles for success. Don't blame it on the Devil. Accept responsibility and seek God for victory.

Scripture References: Deuteronomy 28:47-48; Deuteronomy 28:17

2. An Inability to "Be Yourself"

- a. A dark, oppressive influence inhibits you from fully expressing yourself.
- b. You never feel completely free to be yourself.
- c. You see yourself in a negative light, and never see your God-given gifts and talents.
- d. You are controlled by what others think and struggle with a low-self-esteem.
- e. You see others in your family who also deal with the same problems.

This stronghold could simply be your inability to see yourself as God sees you.

3. A History of Mental, Emotional Breakdowns, or Severe Chronic Depression

- a. You feel as though you are constantly on the verge of a nervous breakdown.
- b. Anxiety is a part of life for you.
- c. Simple situations and problems overwhelm you.
- d. You have a family history of nervousness and anxiety.

This might be from a stronghold of fear. II Timothy 1:7 ***For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind.***

Scripture References: Deuteronomy 28:20; Deuteronomy 28:28; Deuteronomy 28:34

4. A History of Occult Activity, Demonic or Oppressive Spirits

- a. Superstitions
- b. Involved in the occult, (e.g., witchcraft, astrology, spiritualism or divination)
- c. Opening one's self to powers of the spiritual realm, such as pre-cognition or other psychic abilities
- d. Severe trauma, with evidence of effects passed on through the family (e.g., drowning, resulting in fear of water in other members, especially descendants)
- e. Made a blood covenant with Satan or involved in satanic worship
- f. Involved with a witch or other persons involved in the occult

5. Historical Family Connections

- a. Involvement with events of great sin, evil or trauma, (e.g., massacres, plagues, slavery, conquests, etc)
- b. Ethnic origin issues; negative traits, cultural evils, oppression, curses. (Ex: a culture that is entrenched in witchcraft)

6. Religious History

- a. All non-Judeo/Christian religions in the family or ancestral history, (Islam, Buddhism, etc...)

7. An Inability to Control Your Anger.

- a. A family history of abuse or uncontrolled anger
- b. An obsessive, uncontrollable rage and anger in your life

- c. Outbursts of anger that come out of nowhere.
8. A Tendency to Yield to Sinful Sexual Behaviors.
- a. This is more than just yielding to temptations that are common to man.
 - b. You are dwelling upon sinful and harmful sexual misconduct.
 - c. You have an inability to resist pornography. (This is an addiction. It is more than just occasionally yielding to the flesh.)
 - d. You have a family history of sexual sins.
 - e. Adultery is a repeated behavior in your families history
 - f. You have a constant "battle in the mind" and an obsession to unnatural sexual sins such as homosexuality, molestation, adultery, pedophilia, bestiality, cross-dressing, etc...

These are definitely areas of demonic oppression that must be broken.

9. A History of Repeated Chronic Sickness (especially if hereditary)
Not every form of sickness or disease is the direct result of a curse or sin. Many things can cause sickness and disease. Simply listen to the Holy Spirit, if you sense Him speak that your Chronic sickness is from a stronghold or curse – then mark it down.
- a. A family history of chronic sickness
 - b. A constant battle with different forms of chronic illnesses.

Scripture References: Deuteronomy 28:21; Deuteronomy 28:22; Deuteronomy 28:27
Deuteronomy 28:59; Deuteronomy 28:61

10. A Breakdown of Marriages, and Family Alienation
Countless parents in the present generation have experienced this stronghold.
- a. You have a family history of divorce.
 - b. You continually involve yourself in relationships that are unhealthy and harmful.
 - c. Your family history is one of strife within the extended family
 - d. You see the destruction that divorce causes, but feel powerless to deal with the situation.
 - e. You often see the quick way out of a situation, rather than confronting it and dealing with the issues.
11. A Constant Bombardment of Suicidal Thoughts
- a. You have a family history of suicides or attempted suicides
 - b. You sometimes sense life is just too difficult.
 - c. You feel that others would be better off, if you weren't around.
12. Destructive or Abnormal Patterns or Relationships
- a. You can see a history of addictions in your family.
 - b. You can see a family history of Abuse (emotional, mental or physical)
 - c. You see a history of hostility and or controlling habits in your family.
 - d. You have constant thoughts of revenge, bitterness, anger or depression

All of the strongholds (and curses) listed can be broken by the power of the blood of Jesus Christ.

Revelation 12:11a *And they _____ him by the blood of the _____ and by the word of their testimony,*

Causes of Strongholds

The following is a list of the causes of the main strongholds (or curses) that commonly afflict our lives. These are in no way a complete list of the causes.

1. False gods (Exodus 20:1-5)
2. Various moral and ethical sins (Deuteronomy 27:15-26)
3. Anti-Semitism (Numbers 24:9)
4. Legalism, carnality, apostasy (Jeremiah 17:5)
5. Theft, perjury, robbing God (Zechariah 5:1-4)
6. Authority figures (Deuteronomy 5:16)
7. Self-imposed curses or strongholds due to sin... (Matthew 12:36-37)
8. Servants of satan
9. Soulless prayers (Proverbs 28:9)

The Divine Exchange:

- a. **Jesus** was punished that I might be forgiven.
- b. **Jesus** was wounded that I might be healed.
- c. **Jesus** was made sin with my sinfulness that I might become righteous with His righteousness.
- d. **Jesus** died my death that I might share His life.
- e. **Jesus** became poor, that I might become rich with His riches.
- f. **Jesus** bore my shame that I might share His glory.
- g. **Jesus** endured my rejection that I might have His acceptance as a child of God.
- h. **Jesus** became a curse that I might receive a blessing.

Galatians 3:13 *Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, having become a curse for us for it is written, 'Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree.'*

How to Break Strongholds & Curses

- a. Confess your faith in Christ and what He has already done on the cross to break the curse in your life.
- b. Repent of all rebellion and sin. (James 4:7)
- c. Claim forgiveness for all sins
- d. Forgive anyone who has harmed you or wronged you.
- e. Renounce all contact with anything pertaining to the occult or the satanic. Pray a prayer of release from the strongholds in your life. In the prayer, name the strongholds in your life that the Holy Spirit has spoken to you about.

Prayer of Release and Healing: *Father God, I believe that the curse was broken when Jesus died on the cross. I give up all my rebellion, my harboring rejection, bitterness and unforgiveness. I give up my sins and submit myself to You.*

I confess all my sins before you and ask for your forgiveness. I forgive all who have harmed me. I believe that on the cross, Jesus paid the price for me to have a life of victory and freedom.

I receive Your gift to break the strongholds in my life. I receive your gift to break the curses that have wreaked havoc on my families lives. Through Jesus, I now cast down every stronghold built up in my life by the enemy. Strongholds that I have willfully allowed to settle in my life personally.

In particular, I cast down the stronghold(s) or curses of:

In the mighty name of Jesus, I cast these strongholds (curses) down and renounce the power of the enemy in my life. By faith I now receive the release, and I thank you and love you.

In Jesus name, Amen!

About the Occult

One of Satan's favorite weapons against us is occult involvement. The occult (meaning "secret" or "hidden") is Satan's world of the spirit. Occult involvement means that we seek to gain knowledge or power from a spiritual source other than God. The special danger of occult involvement is that it appeals to our spiritual hunger, which is our innate desire to find the Lord, and diverts us from Him into the occult underworld – a dead end.

God's Word on the occult

The Old Testament strictly forbids occult participation in a number of passages. Deuteronomy 18:10-12 reads: *Let no one be found among you who practices divination or sorcery, interprets omens, engages in witchcraft, or casts spells, or who is a medium or spiritist (some translations say "wizard") or who consults the dead. Anyone who does these things is detestable to the Lord.*

Webster's definitions read:

Divination – an act of foretelling the future, assuming the help of unseen powers.

Enchant – to use magic words or charms to place (another) under a spell.

Medium – one supposedly having access to supernatural agencies and knowledge or power derived from them.

Necromancer – one who claims to reveal the future by communication with the dead.

Witch – one thought to have supernatural powers through a contract with Satan.

Wizard – a sorcerer, one possessed of magic influence.

We read in Isaiah 47:11-15: *But evil shall come on you; you shall not know its origin. And mischief shall fall on you; you shall not be able to put it off. And desolation shall come on you suddenly, you shall not know. Stand now with your spells, and with the multitude of your sorceries, in which you have wearied yourself since your youth. Perhaps you will be able to profit; perhaps you may bring terror. You are exhausted by your many plans; now let the astrologers stand up and save you, the stargazers, making known what is coming on you into the new moons. Behold, they shall be as stubble; the fire shall burn them; they shall not deliver themselves from the power of the flame; there shall not be a coal to warm them; nor fire, to sit before it. So they are to you with whom you labored, your merchants from your youth. Each one wanders to his own way; none shall save you.*

By the time of the New Testament, the Hebrews had pretty well banished occult things from their home country, so Jesus did not have to deal with it specifically (except when Satan tempted Him to turn stones into bread). However, as soon as Christians began to move into heathen lands, they began to be exposed to occult practices. Acts 19:18-20 states, *And many who believed came and confessed and showed their deeds. Also many of those practicing the curious arts, bringing together the books, burned them before all. And they counted the prices of them and found it to be fifty thousand pieces of silver. So*

the Word of God grew mightily and prevailed. In Acts 8:20, when Simon The Magician tried to buy the Holy Spirit to add to his bag of tricks, Peter answered *May your money perish with you...*”

In II Thessalonians 2:9-11, Paul warns about the last days: *whose coming is according to the working of Satan with all power and signs and lying wonders, and with all deceit of unrighteousness in those who perish, because they did not receive the love of the truth, so that they might be saved. And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie.*

Occult Involvement

We need to remember that **all occult involvement brings spiritual confusion**. This confusion begins when we recognize that there are other spiritual forces besides God, and when we use them, attempt to consult them, or are preoccupied with staying “on their good side.” When we open ourselves up to occult involvement, we violate the first commandment, *You shall have no other God but ME* (Exodus 20:30 and Jesus’ commandment, *You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength* (Deuteronomy 6:4-9, Matthew 22:37, mark 12:30, Luke 10:27).

Remember, too, that the wrong things we do in innocence and ignorance hurt as much as the things we do deliberately. It only takes one time. Satan has set occult traps throughout our world into which he hopes we will fall. God’s way of healing us through confession, renouncement and forgiveness works not only for our sins but also for our errors and our ignorance, as well. **We must confess and receive forgiveness for our occult involvement, whether it was done in sin, error or ignorance.**

The Occult Check List

The following list is trying to give a solid framework for occult renouncement, and it is based on information on the teachings of Christians who are considered experts in this area.

Circle each one in which you have participated, so you can confess it:

Have you, other family members or ancestors ever – just for fun, out of curiosity or in earnest – done any of the following?

Soothsayers/fortune Tellers (Deuteronomy 18:9-16; Daniel 2:26-28; Isaiah 2:6, 47:10-15; Micah 5:12; Acts 16:16)

1. Have you ever had your fortune told by tea leaves, palm reading, crystal ball, fortuneteller, etc?
2. Have you ever read or followed horoscope, or had a chart made for yourself to predict your future? Have you ever read other type(s) of birth signs?
3. Have you ever been hypnotized, practiced self-hypnosis, yoga or transcendental meditation? (In biblical days, hypnotism was spoken of as “casting a spell,” and a hypnotist was called a “charmer”) Have you ever been involved in charming or enchanting (attempts to use spirit power)?

Necromancy, Spiritualism (1 Samuel 28:7-11; II King 21:6; Isaiah 8:19-22; Leviticus 19:31 and 20:6)

4. Have you ever attended a séance or spiritualist meeting?
5. Do you believe in reincarnation? Have you ever had a reincarnation reading?

6. Have you ever played with Ouija board, crystal ball, Dungeons & Dragons or other occult games?
7. Have you ever had a Tarot card reading or practiced cartomancy (using playing cards for fortune telling or other magical purposes)?
8. Have you ever played games of an occult nature, using ESP, telepathy, hypnotism, etc.?
9. Have you ever consulted a medium, spiritualist or numerologist? Have you ever acted as a medium? Have you ever practiced channeling?
10. Have you ever seen and/or communicated with apparitions that are not of God?
11. Have you ever sought healing through magic spells or charms, or through a Christian Scientist or spiritualist? Have you ever sought psychic healing or had psychic surgery?
12. Have you ever been involved in acupuncture? (This practice is an example of one that is not always occultic, but it can be of the occult and should be renounced in case any occult or demonic influence was present.) You must make sure if you are considering acupuncture that the one conducting the treatment is not tied to a religious root, rather it is purely medical.
13. Have you ever practiced table lifting, levitation of objects, pendulum swinging, lifting of bodies, automatic writing, astral travel or soul-travel?
14. Have you ever used a charm or amulet for any kind of protection or “good luck”, be it a rabbits foot, four leaf clover, A image of a Saint, or even a cross? Our protection doesn’t come from an object of any kind, but from Jesus alone. Are you superstitious?
15. Have you ever participated in chain letters or emails? (Ones that say you will be blessed or even cursed if you forward or do not forward the letter.) This practice is seeking a blessing or avoiding a curse, based upon your actions outside of God will. This is superstition. Blessings only come from God.
16. Have you ever practiced water witching or dowsing to find out information such as where to dig a well?
17. To your knowledge, have you ever practiced any other kinds of black arts?

Occult Books, “Contact” Objects and Other Media (Exodus 19:25-20:6; Deuteronomy 5:8-10,7:4-6 and 25-26; I Kings 14:7-11; II Kings 23:1-25; Psalm 97:7; Isaiah 42:17; Acts 19:19-20; II Corinthians 10:3-5)

18. Have you read or possessed books on astrology, interpretation of dreams, augury or interpretation of omens, cults or other religious groups which deviate from Scripture from Christian doctrine such as Christian Science, Unity, Scientology or Science of Mind?
19. Have you read or possessed books on witchcraft, fortune telling, magic, ESP, psychic phenomena or possession?
20. Do you have anything in your home that was given to you by someone in the occult? Do you have anything in your home of an occult nature?
21. Have you followed the writings of Edgar Cayce, Jean Dixon, Shirley Maclaine, L.”Ron” Hubbard (Church of Scientology) or any other New Age author?
22. Do you find yourself interested in demonic types of movies such as The Exorcist, Rosemary’s Baby or The Omen? Are you drawn to horror shows or scary movies such as Friday the 13th? Are you fascinated with evil or the occult?
23. Have you accepted the humanist theory that man is self-sufficient and does not need God?
24. Have you ever listened to hard or Acid Rock music with a satanic influence or music with a New Age influence?
25. Have you ever worshipped in a shrine or temple of a non-Judeo/Christian religion? Do you possess any books, articles or statues from any of these religions?

Sorcery Or Magic (II Kings 17:17, 21:6; Isaiah 47:9; Malachi 3:5; Acts 8:11, 13:4-12, Revelation 18:23, 21:8)

26. Have you ever practiced sorcery or magic?
27. Have you ever practiced mind control over any person or animal cast a magic spell or sought a psychic experience? Have you ever contacted a psychic in person or through a psychic hotline?

Devil Worship (II Chronicles 11:15; psalm 106:37; I Corinthians 10:20-22; Revelation 9:20-21, 13:4)

28. Have you ever made a pact with Satan or been involved in or witnessed Satan worship or black magic?
29. Have you ever worn, owned or had in your home the symbol of the Egyptian ankh (a cross with a ring top that is used in satanic rites?)
30. Have you ever celebrated a black mass? Have you ever witnessed a black mass?
31. Have you ever made a blood covenant or pact?

Witchcraft (Galatians 5:19-20; I Samuel 15:23, 28:7; II Kings 9:22,23,24; I Chronicles 10:13; Isaiah 8:19, 19:3, 29:4; Micah 5:12)

32. Have you ever attended witchcraft or **voodoo** activities?
33. Have you ever been involved in **Freemasonry**, Eastern Star, De Molay or Rainbow Girls?

Yoga

36. Have you ever participated in yoga, even for exercise?

Why Yoga Is Contrary To The Word Of God:

According to Webster's New World Dictionary, yoga is "a mystic Hindu discipline for achieving union with the supreme spirit through meditation, prescribed postures, controlled breathing, etc."

The word "yoga" means "union with god," and the goal is to unite one's transitory (temporary) self with the infinite Brahman, the Hindu concept of "God." This god is not a literal being, but is an impersonal spiritual substance that is one with nature and the cosmos. This view is called "pantheism," the belief that everything is God and that reality consists only of the universe and nature. Because everything is God, the yoga philosophy makes no distinction between man and God.

For many Christians in the West who don't understand the history behind it, yoga is simply a means of physical exercise and strengthening and improving flexibility of the muscles. However, the philosophy behind yoga is much more than physically improving oneself. It is an ancient practice derived from India, believed to be the path to spiritual growth and enlightenment.

Over the last several decades yoga has been embraced by the mainstream of society – and even the church. We find yoga classes offered at YWCAs, church fellowship halls, and even elementary schools.

The question becomes, is it possible for a Christian to isolate the physical aspects of yoga as simply a method of exercise, without incorporating the spirituality or philosophy behind it? Yoga originated with a blatantly anti-Christian philosophy, and that philosophy has not changed. It teaches one to focus on

oneself instead of on the one true God. It encourages its participants to seek the answers to life's difficult questions within their own conscience instead of in the Word of God. It also leaves one open to deception from God's enemy, who searches for victims that he can turn away from God (1 Peter 5:8).

1 Peter 5:8 - ***Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour.***

Yoga is a dangerous practice for the Christian and leads seekers *away* from God rather than to Him. You may say, "Well, I'm not doing any of the meditation stuff. I'm just following the exercises." Spoken from a woman who taught yoga for years: *It is impossible, however, to separate the subtleties of yoga the technique from yoga the religion. I know because I taught and practiced hatha yoga for years. Hatha yoga is the most popular yoga style available on store-bought videos and in most gyms.*

Hatha yoga is the aspect of yoga which focuses on the physical body through special postures, breathing exercises, and concentration or meditation. It is a means to prepare the body for the spiritual exercises, with fewer obstacles, in order to achieve enlightenment. The practice of yoga is based on the belief that man and God are one. It is little more than self-worship disguised as a high level of spirituality.

The postures in yoga are offerings of worship to 330 million Hindu gods. Yoga postures really are an offering of worship to other gods. The Bible tells us in Psalm 81:9, that we should not worship any other god, but the one true God.

As Christians, you are instructed to "be transformed by the **renewing** of your mind" (Romans 12:2), not the *emptying* of your mind. The Word teaches us that transformation occurs as we meditate and feed on the Word of God – renewing our minds by filling them with *God's* thoughts, not emptying them or filling them with the prideful thoughts of man.

It seems the enemy has a counterfeit for almost everything the Lord offers. While mind-numbing tranquility may feel good for a time, it's a poor substitute for the "peace which surpasses all understanding" (*Philippians 4:7*) and "the joy of the Lord (*which*) is your strength" (*Nehemiah 8:10*).

Whatever we do should be done for God's glory (1 Corinthians 10:31), and we would be wise to heed the words of the apostle Paul: "Fix your thoughts on what is true and honorable and right. Think about things that are pure and lovely and admirable. Think about things that are excellent and worthy of praise" (Philippians 4:8, NLT).



What is the Baptism in the Holy Spirit?

The Baptism in the Holy Spirit is the fulfillment of Jesus' words concerning the "*promise of the Father*" (Luke 24:49). It is a baptism with **POWER!** Jesus is the one who Baptizes in the Holy Spirit, and through this experience, the kingdom of God is manifested in our lives.



After receiving the Baptism in the Holy Spirit, we have the power to witness, to resist sin and the devil, and to be all that God intended for us to be in His kingdom. The phrase *Baptism in the Holy Spirit* means to be immersed in a relationship with the Holy Spirit.

When someone is Born Again (receives salvation), God, the Holy Spirit, comes to live inside of him. (John 3:6-7, Romans 8:9-11). When Jesus Baptizes someone in the Holy Spirit (Matthew 3:11), he is immersed in or ***filled with the power of the Spirit*** (Acts 1:8).

The Bible shows that it is very important for **ALL** Believers to be ***Baptized in the Holy Spirit*** and to speak in tongues (Acts 19:2-6).

What is speaking in tongues?

In Acts 2:1-4, the followers of Christ were baptized with the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost, fulfilling Jesus' command to wait in Jerusalem for this experience (Acts 1:4).

When they were filled with the Holy Spirit, they began to speak in tongues. These tongues were not a language that they had learned, but a Spirit-inspired language that came directly from God Himself.

This is a special communication and a perfect prayer to God (Romans 8:26). This is our spirit speaking to the Holy Spirit (**I Corinthians 14:2**). Your Personal Prayer Language should be a regular portion of your prayer time (**I Corinthians 14:14-15**). Everyone who has received the Baptism in the Holy Spirit has the ability to pray in their Prayer Language in Tongues. Every Believer should seek the *Baptism in the Holy Spirit*.

How do you speak in tongues?

Many have raised questions about how someone speaks in tongues. First, you must understand that it is the Spirit of God that "***gives the utterance***." In other words, the Holy Spirit gives you the words to say. You must speak them, but He is faithful to give them.

Just as your mind tells you what to say when you want to speak, the Holy Spirit will give you the words to say when you speak in tongues. However, you must be the one to speak the words. When you speak, your voice box, tongue, lungs, and mouth all work together to form words. When this happens, the very words that you want to speak come out. The same thing happens when you speak in tongues. Without you having to think about it, the Holy Spirit will direct all

your speaking faculties to speak the words of the Spirit. You will speak, but it is He who will tell you what to say.

In John 7:38-39, Jesus tells the disciples, ***“He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart shall flow rivers of living water.”*** The Greek word for heart (belly in the King James version) is defined as the “innermost part of a man; the soul; the heart as the seat of thought, feeling, and choice.”

Imagine what Jesus meant when He said that “out of your heart (belly),” rivers of living water would flow. The Baptism in the Holy Spirit is a biblical experience that fulfills the desire of Jesus for believers to receive the power of God in their lives.

Here are some things to remember concerning the Baptism in the Holy Spirit:

If you are saved (born again), the Holy Spirit lives inside of you. (I Corinthians 3:16, Romans 8:9).

The Baptism in the Holy Spirit is a gift from God that comes **AFTER** salvation.

There are no examples in the Bible of individuals who did not receive the *Baptism in the Holy Spirit* who sincerely and honestly desired to receive it (**Acts 2:39**). For this promise is for **ALL** Believers.



Acts 2:39 *For the _____ is to you and to your children, and to all who are afar off, as many as the Lord our God will call."*



All Believers are entitled to and should seek the promise of the Father, the “Baptism in the Holy Spirit” and fire, according to the command of our Lord Jesus Christ. This was the normal experience of ALL in the early Christian Church. (Luke 11:11-13; Joel 2:28-29)

THE BAPTISM IN THE HOLY SPIRIT GIVES US THE POWER TO SERVE AND WITNESS (Acts 1:8).

AN OVERFLOWING FULLNESS OF THE SPIRIT (John 7:37-39; Acts 4:8).

AN INTENSIFIED CONSECRATION TO GOD AND DEDICATION TO HIS WORK (Acts 2:42).

IT GIVES YOU A MORE ACTIVE LOVE FOR CHRIST, FOR HIS WORD AND FOR THE LOST (Mark 16:20).

IT EDIFIES, CHARGES UP OUR FAITH, STRENGTHENS OUR WALK WITH BOLDNESS AND POWER AND BUILDS OUR FAITH (1 Corinthians 14:4; Jude 20).

IT CREATES A DEEPER AWARENESS AND OPERATION OF THE GIFTS OF THE SPIRIT (1 Corinthians 12:1-31; Hebrews 2:3-4).

THE HOLY SPIRIT HELPS US TO PRAY (Our prayer language in tongues) (Romans 8:26).

USED FOR PRAYING AND SINGING (I Corinthians 14:14-15).

A SPECIAL AND PERFECT COMMUNICATION (PRAYER) WITH GOD (Romans 8:26).

Our prayers often have issues of the flesh – soulish and selfish desires, but when we **pray in tongues**, it is our spirit speaking directly with the Holy Spirit, a perfect prayer. The perfect will and desires of God. The Holy Spirit is directing our prayer and therefore we are praying the very will and purposes of God.

A person may be saved and baptized in water, but not yet be Baptized in the Holy Spirit (Acts 8:14-16).

Speaking in tongues and praising God are signs, or evidences, of the Baptism in the Holy Spirit (Acts 10:44-46).

Some Believers may receive the Baptism in the Holy Spirit before they are baptized in water (Acts 10:46-48).

The word *baptize* means “to put under,” “to cover,” or “immersed”. When a person is Baptized in the Holy Spirit, he is totally immersed, or enveloped, in the Spirit of God.

IN CONCLUSION – Let me review:

The Baptism In The Holy Spirit gives us the power to serve and witness.

All Believers are entitled to and should seek the promise of the Father, the “Baptism in the Holy Spirit” and fire, according to the command of our Lord Jesus Christ. This was the normal experience of ALL in the early Christian Church.

Here are steps to help you receive the Baptism In The Holy Spirit:

A. REMOVE ALL BARRIERS:

- Deal with any sin issues, unforgiveness, doctrinal hang-ups, pride, or any unclean thing that may block you from receiving.
- Why do I desire to receive the *Baptism In The Holy Spirit*? Evaluate your motives. Is there desire to receive the gift birthed in pride?
- **Here are some causes why people do not release their prayer language:**
 - a. Pride: Fear of sounding foolish.
 - b. Accepting the lie of the enemy that you are not worthy to receive.
 - c. Sin issues.
 - d. A fear the tongue would come from “self” (the flesh) and not from the Holy Spirit.
 - e. A sense that the Holy Spirit would overtake you and control your actions, voice and tongue. (He gives the utterance – you speak it forth)
 - f. Expecting your experience to be like someone else’s.

(All of these are different ways and reactions of how different people received the Baptism in the Holy Spirit, Laying on of hands or no laying on of hands; in a group, or alone; warm fuzzies or very little emotions, ecstatic emotions or very calm)

These may be some of the reasons why your verbalization of your prayer language is hindered. However know that you receive the *Baptism in the Holy Spirit* when you sincerely ask for it, you have the ability to pray in your prayer language in tongues. It is very important that you continue to seek to release your tongue, because we are edified and empowered by the Holy Spirit – when we pray in tongues.

B. REQUEST: Jesus said all we have to do is ask and we would receive.

Luke 11:13 - *If you then, being evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him!*

- The Prayer Minister will place their hand lightly on your shoulder and pray for you.
- Confess any sin, and renounce anything from your past that would hinder you from receiving the Holy Spirit?
- Tell the Lord that you want to be *Baptized in the Holy Spirit* with the evidence of speaking in tongues.
- Here is a prayer to pray with them: (Student will repeat this after the prayer minister)

Father, remove all barriers of sin and anything that hinders me from receiving all that You have for me. I ask now that for the Baptism in the Holy Spirit with the evidence of speaking in my personal prayer language. Fill me with your power so that I can be a better witness for you. I now step out in faith believing that I have received Your wonderful gift in Jesus name.

C. RECIEVE:

- The moment you ask for the *Baptism In The Holy Spirit* you received it.
- Reach out by faith and take hold of this gift that God freely gives to all those who believe in Him.
- Don't analyze this with your mind, but allow your spirit to receive this gift.
- Receive by faith. You must understand that it is the Spirit of God that "gives the utterance". The Holy Spirit gives us the words. We must speak them, but He is faithful to give them. Jesus won't grab your tongue and force you to speak. We do the speaking.

D.WORSHIP HIM: We are always encouraged to seek the giver, not just the gifts.

- As you're seeking and worshipping God, you will sense a new language. New words that you've never spoken before will begin to rise in your spirit.

F. RELEASE:

- This is where our faith comes in. At this point, exercise your faith and begin to speak in your new tongue. By faith, stop praying in English and start praying in tongues.
- It is kind of like a baby learning to talk. As first it just might be a few syllables. Just speak the words that the Holy Spirit prompts. What it sounds like is up to Him.
- The Prayer Minister will have their hand lightly on your shoulder and begin to pray softly in their own prayer language. Don't be afraid, nor care about what your prayer language might sound like – just begin to speak it out.

- You may at first have only a few words, but go ahead and speak those in faith, and others will follow. As they yield your tongue to the Spirit, you will begin to feel a wonderful release of worship. Peace and joy, two fruits of the Spirit, will flood over you with a new sense of the presence of God. You will never be the same!
- When we speak, our voice box, tongue, lungs, and mouth all work together to form words. When this happens, the very words you want to speak come out. When we speak in tongues, the Holy Spirit directs all of our speaking faculties to speak the “words of the Spirit”. It is us who speaks, but He will tell us what to say. **The Baptism in the Holy Spirit is a biblical experience that fulfills the desire that Jesus had for every believer to receive the power of God in his or her life.**

SUMMARY -- We should **ask, seek, and knock to receive** the **Holy Spirit** who will come and teach us to pray. (Luke 11:19, 13, Romans 8:26)

- Pray in your prayer language as often as possible. In the car, taking a walk, or any other time which is available for prayer.
- All Believers who earnestly ask for the Baptism in the Holy Spirit receive and has the ability to pray in their own prayer language in tongues, whether they choose to use it or not. Sometimes fear keeps people from praying in tongues, even though they received the Baptism in the Holy Spirit and have the ability to pray in tongues.

Putting Off the Old & Putting on the New Man

Now that we have spent some time looking back at our lives and dealt with issues such as strongholds, past hurts and unforgiveness and we have viewed these areas through the cross and what Christ accomplished through the shedding of His blood, we want to take another step and begin walking in the victory that Christ has won for us.

PUTTING ON THE WHOLE ARMOR OF GOD

Paul in verse 10 makes a very important point regarding spiritual warfare that we need to always remember. We never want to think that we will be effective in and of our own strength. We need to realize that Paul's exhortation was **to be _____ in the Lord and in the power of _____ might.** Any efforts to fight this enemy with any weapon or strength outside of that which only God can supply is doomed to fail.



In verse 11 Paul makes another strong point that we don't want to miss. He says **to put on the _____ armor of God.** Not just one piece, not half of the armor, but the whole armor. This is crucial for us to be able to stand against the devil and the tactics that he will surely try to use to destroy us. God desires for each of us to be able to stand on our own. We each need to be personally responsible to put on our armor.

Paul reinforces these points by reminding us of who we are up against in verse 12. We wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against **principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this _____, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the _____ places.** Paul wants us to fully understand we are not in a human fight against other individuals, but against a spiritual fight with the enemy.

We are in a spiritual battle against Satan that is taking place for three main strategic objectives:

1. **To keep unbelievers in the dark.** Jesus calls us to preach the good news to those who are in the darkness in order that they might come into the light, to a knowledge of the truth and be set free that they might become children of God. (2 Corinthians 4:4)
2. **To render believers spiritually ineffective.** Every Believer throughout the whole world is undergoing the same attack by our adversary the devil. We need to always be on guard so that we do not find ourselves caught in the teeth of the one who seeks to devour us like a roaring lion. **(1 Pet. 5:8-9)**
3. **To hinder God's work in the world.** Jesus himself experienced many attempts of the devil to try to stop Him from doing what He was sent into the world to accomplish. (Luke 4:13) Paul tells us that many times he was hindered from coming to see those who were in Thessalonica. (1 Thessalonians 2:18) Satan is always looking for ways to hinder God's work. We need to focus on the fact that Satan is a defeated foe and that in Christ, we are to be victorious over Satan and his schemes. God made a provision for us to be victorious over Satan through His Son Jesus. Now as Christians all that we have

to do according to verse 13, is to put on our armor so that we will be **able to _____ in the evil day**. No soldier would be so foolish as to fail to put on his armor when he knew that he was going to war against an enemy whose expressed purpose was to mortally wound him.

To put on the armor of God is not simply a mental or verbal routine. It is a process that will require discipline and effort on our part so that we might fully understand and know how to use and apply the Word of God in our daily lives.

THE BELT OF TRUTH: (vs. 14a **Stand therefore having _____ your waist with truth**)

To gird means to encircle, surround or bind with a belt, to prepare oneself for action

John 14:6 *Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.*

John 8:31-32 *Then Jesus said to those Jews who believed Him, "If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed. And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.*

I John 1:5-6 *This is the message which we have heard from Him and declare to you, that God is light and in Him is no darkness at all. If we say that we have fellowship with Him, and walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth.*

THE BREASTPLATE OF RIGHTEOUSNESS: (vs. 14b *...having _____ the breastplate of righteousness,*)

2 Corinthians 5:21 *For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.*

I John 3:7-10 *Little children, let no one deceive you. He who practices righteousness is righteous, just as He is righteous. He who sins is of the devil, for the devil has sinned from the beginning. For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that He might destroy the works of the devil. Whoever has been born of God does not sin, for His seed remains in him; and he cannot sin, because he has been born of God. In this the children of God and the children of the devil are manifest: Whoever does not practice righteousness is not of God, nor is he who does not love his brother.*

SANDALS OF PEACE: (vs. 15 *and having _____ your feet with the _____ of the gospel of peace;*)

Luke 1:79 *To give light to those who sit in darkness and the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace.*

John 14:27 *Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.*

Romans 10:15 *And how shall they preach unless they are sent? As it is written: 'How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the gospel of peace, who bring glad tidings of good things!'*

THE SHIELD OF FAITH : (vs. 16 *above all, taking the _____ of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of wicked one.*)

A shield is used as a tool of defense to protect one from the fiery darts of the enemy. Our faith (our foundation of what we believe and hope for) is a great shield of defense from the tactics of the devil.

In ancient times, when an army would go to war, they would inter-lock their shields to provide maximum protection from the enemy's darts. The Believer receives maximum protection from the tactics of the enemy, when our shield of faith is inter-locked and committed to a Biblical community of Believers.

LifeCells provide a Biblical community where Believers are able to stand together in faith.

Matthew 21:21-22 *So Jesus answered and said to them, 'Assuredly, I say to you, if you have faith and do not doubt, you will not only do what was done to the fig tree, but also if you say to this mountain, 'Be removed and be cast into the sea,' it will be done. And whatever things you ask in prayer, believing, you will receive.*

Romans 1:17 *For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, "The just shall live by faith."*

2 Corinthians 5:7 *For we walk by faith, not by sight.*

THE HELMET OF SALVATION: (vs.17a *And _____ the helmet of salvation,*)

Acts 4:12 *Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.*

Romans 1:16 *For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek.*

THE SWORD OF THE SPIRIT: (vs. 17b *and the _____ of the Spirit which is the _____ of God.*)

The final step in putting on the armor of God is found in verse 18. *praying _____ with all prayer and supplication in the _____, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the _____.*

As we are successful in putting on the armor of God, and praying as we should, two things will happen:

1. We will not only be able to stand but to *withstand* when the enemy comes in like a flood.
2. The mystery of the gospel will be made known because boldness will be evident in our lives and in the lives of those we are praying for.

We are in a spiritual battle, for us to be strategically effective, we must arm ourselves appropriately. We must obey the Word of God and **put off** those things that the Word calls sin and put on the attributes and character of Jesus.

We began this ADVANCE , like a roller coaster. We began high then dove down head first into our sins, forgiveness, wounds, and strongholds. Then we began to ascend out from the bottom and rebuild our lives free from sin, unforgiveness, and wounds. Realizing that the process of healing is a continuous journey, we hope you will leave enriched, equipped, healed and deeper in your walk and maturity with the Lord.



We end this **LIFE ADVANCE** with a session on **PASSION FOR HIS PURPOSE**.

1. Purpose is the foundation for lasting fruitful ministry. Behind every successful leader is a task he or she feels called and compelled to accomplish.
2. **YOU ARE HERE: TO BE EQUIPPED AS A LEADER...TO HAVE A PASSION FOR HIS PURPOSE.**
3. LEADERSHIP: Is one who influences another.
4. PASSION: An intense driving enthusiasm (overpowering devotion) in working for a cause.
5. PURPOSE: The object for which something exists.

We all need to walk in a divine purpose for our lives. It is the reason for our existence. We, as Believers, believe that God created us. He knew us in our mother's womb (Psalm 139:13), that we are fearfully and wonderfully made (Psalm 139:14) and that God created us for a specific purpose. He did not create us to just go through life, buy a home, have children, and die. God created us with a reason to live. It is the very reason why we exist. Everything we do, (our jobs, our friends and hobbies), are a source to fulfill His purpose in our lives. We do not live for these things, rather we live for God's purpose. You were created with a PURPOSE, a destiny with God.

Rick Warren's book, *The Purpose Driven Life*, in chapter 1 begins by saying, "It is not about you." God created you to fulfill His purpose on this earth. Our purpose in life is not to fulfill our own selfish wishes, but to fulfill God's purpose and what He has placed us here for.

Ephesians 2:10 *For we are His _____, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God _____ beforehand that we should walk in them.*

Ultimately, it is not about us, it is all about Jesus.

We want you to end this Life Advance with an intense enthusiasm - A PASSION - to work for your very reason for your existence.

Acts 20:24 But none of these things move me; nor do I count my life dear to myself, so that I may finish my race with joy, and the ministry which I receive from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the gospel of the grace of God.

No, much rather, those members of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary. And those members of the body which we think to be less honorable, on these we bestow greater honor; and our unrepresentable parts have greater modesty.*

V. I HAVE NO PROMISE OF TOMORROW, THEREFORE I MUST WORK TODAY.

John 9:4 *I must work the works of Him who sent Me while it is day; the night is coming when no one can work.*

John 4:35 *Do you not say, 'There are still four months and then comes the harvest'? Behold, I say to you, lift up your eyes and look at the fields for they are already white for harvest!*

Luke 12:19-20 *And I will say to my soul, 'Soul, you have many goods laid up for many years; take your ease; eat, drink, and be merry.' "But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul will be required of you; then whose will those things be which you have provided?'*

CHALLENGE TO FULFILL GOD'S PURPOSE FOR YOUR LIFE

Rick Warren's book, "The Purpose Driven Life" defines our purpose in five points:

- #1 - I was planned for God's pleasure. (The Biblical term for this is, "WORSHIP".) - Mark 12:30
- #2 - I was formed for God's family. (The Biblical term for this is, "FELLOWSHIP".) - Romans 12:5
- #3 - I was created to become like Christ. (The Biblical term for this is, "DISCIPLESHIP".) - Phil. 2:5
- #4 - I was shaped to serve God. (The Biblical term for this is, "MINISTRY".) - I Peter 4:10
 - * We serve God by serving others. *
- #5 - I was made for a mission. (The Biblical term for this is, "EVANGELISM".) - Colossians 4:5

Absolutely nothing is more fulfilling than seeing lives saved and growing in Jesus. Nothing brings more joy than living out your purpose in this world.

Be about the Father's business. Walk in the victory of the Lord. Don't give up. Run the race to win the prize (I Corinthians 9:24-27). Don't underestimate how much God can use you.
